Warren Theatre Arts Lesson Plan

Grade Level: Theatre IV

Lesson Title: Scene Direction

TEKS: 3 A-F – Creative Expression: Production

5H – Create a personal resume or portfolio of theatrical experience.

Lesson: Students will be engaged in a conversation about effective and non-effective direction of dramatic literature. Students will work in small groups in the form of Ink Think to identify the characteristics of effective and non-effective directing practices. The class will then hold an open discussion about their findings.

Project: Students will select a 10-15 minute scene from a script that they will evaluate, analyze cast, direct, and produce in class. Students will create a digital portfolio of their process that will contain the following:

- 1. Rigdon Analysis of the script.
- 2. Ground plan of the set.
- 3. Costume sketches for each character.
- 4. Proposed budget for their production.
- 5. Property plot for their production.
- 6. Director's concept.
- 7. Production photos

Assessment: Final performances will be assessed by the instructor and peers using the attached rubric.
